# NZPCA Dressage Championships 2017 (thanks Niamh for your report)

It was very last minute that I decided to enter the PC Dressage Champs Trials, it would be "good training for eventing" I told myself, and "I won't get in – we've only done level two dressage once, let alone level three!" As I tried and failed again and again to establish a nice sitting-trot, it seemed clear to me that it just wasn't meant to be. Yet on the day of the trials in early November, Smokey and I found ourselves finishing in third place overall and therefore making the team as a senior. At this point I was very confused and alarmed – oh dear… how could we possibly represent Canterbury for dressage? Not to mention that almost all of the talented riders who made the team were strangers to me at this point, and the whole concept was a little frightening.

As training begun with our coach, Jenny, I started to feel a little more optimistic that at least we wouldn't make a complete fool of ourselves and my sitting trot finally started to look semi-normal. In mid-January it was time to set off South on our journey to Mosgiel, Otago with fellow team mates Millie and Kirsty. Of course I was feeling very enthused to be travelling for 7 hours to compete in just three dressage tests... (and no jumping!) Everything ran smoothly; we arrived and checked out the grounds, tended to our horse's needs, I took Smokey for a stretch bareback, and bedded them down in their stables for the night. The next day before competition followed a similar routine but there was a bit



more hard work involved as we were schooling horses and cleaning, plaiting and washing for competition day. We then had skit night in which Canterbury provided the usual quality entertainment.

Nerves were running rather high on the first day of competition. Smokey tried really hard in our practice test, placing mid-field and giving us a good idea of what the afternoon held. Everyone in the team performed exceptionally that afternoon in their championship test, I was the last rider to go and Smokey knew his job well (though he as green to this as me), scoring a 64% and fourth place overall! Through to the next day our team was sitting in first place and so the pressure was on. All us riders were feeling a little tired thanks to our consecutively late nights where we would stay up chatting and tossing a ball around outside at our lovely accommodations until dark. Yet we all put in our best efforts and again some superb results emerged. Smokey pulled off a great test, scoring 65% and fourth place in the senior division again! The many 3rds, 2nds, and 1sts that our Canterbury riders had earned during the two days kept us well in the lead. The prize giving then followed, we were all stoked that our hard work had paid off and that our mounts had worked so tirelessly for us during our time in Mosgiel. We didn't know if we would be keeping our title as the North Island riders still had to compete - later we found out that we came second nationally, the best result for the South Island in a long long time! Though, sadly we had to part with our new rugs and trophy. It was very cool that Milly ended up highest placed junior in the South Island and 2<sup>nd</sup> junior overall in New Zealand, and for the South Island I was awarded the "highest scoring first time senior".



Overall I rate the whole adventure very highly; little did I suspect a few months ago that I'd be representing Canterbury as a rider for dressage. The skills I have taken away from this will be very valuable for the future, and seeing the clear improvement was well worth any struggle faced along the way. To anyone who hopes to achieve something like this, don't doubt yourself because anything is possible – as I have discovered. It's an opportunity to meet plenty of new faces who may end up being great friends of yours, just like the lovely bunch of

girls I'm grateful to now know. Thank you Springston Pony Club for all your support. © Niamh

Please also ensure all show jumping rails are picked up off the ground. Even if you didn't drop them please pick them up so we can keep them in good condition for as long as we can.

Please keep an eye out for "happenings" at the grounds, if you see something which shouldn't be happening, please let a committee member know ASAP.
