SISJC was a really successful competition in terms of results and learning experiences for our riders.

We met on the Monday afternoon for a team meeting and group plaiting. It was lovely to see almost all riders plait their own horses, (with occasional help) and they did a great job, looking super!.

The weather on the first day was perfect, lovely and fine, but not too hot. Most of our riders had super rounds, and the SPC team ended up with 4 placings in the first round and 3





The second day was really hot and the pressure (and just a bit bad luck) got to us in the last two rounds and we had a few more issues. We ended up 4th, which was a wonderful achievement with 25 teams from across the South Island competing. Stella's team, Teviot Blue ended up 6th.

Some riders were asked to ride longer jump off lines and corners to improve their chances of a clear round for the team rather then a higher individual place.

All the riders needed to work out how to best deal with pressure, disappointment and success, as well and supporting other team members through their pressure, success and disappointment. We all had to manage the horse's energy levels over the two days, learning how to not do too much early on, to save energy for later in the competition and how important fitness is when travelling and competing over more than one day.

There were plenty of learning experiences too, both with travelling away with the ponies and being part of a team.



A big congratulations to the riders on their successes and thanks to the parents for all their support and completing our jobs. A special mention to Gemma who individually ended up 2nd in the junior section and Katherine who individually ended up 4th in the senior section, from nearly 50 competitors over the 4 rounds.



Uniform.

There have been some changes in uniform requirements from NZPCA, so we have updated our SPC uniform. (This change is only clothing, riding boots, regulation helmets, back protectors for XC jumping etc are still required as before)

Informal uniform (rallies): Any coloured jodhpurs can be worn at a rally. Short or long sleeve white shirts, brown knitted v-neck jersey or rugby jerseys (can be worn with or without white shirts). Ties optional.

Formal uniform (competitions and sitting certificates) white/beige jodhpurs, white shirt (short or long sleeve), brown jersey (dressage) or rugby jersey, brown tie. To be used for sitting examinations and team dressage or show jumping competitions. Rugby jersey with or without shirt and without tie for games and cross country.

Fees for 2019

This year all members will need to register ONLINE into the new database that has been created by NZPCA. Sharon has circulated these details.

Fees help cover levies to NZPCA and operating costs of running the Branch. Membership fees need to be paid by 31 March 2019. Members have the option of setting up a direct debit plan but they must contact Andy Etheridge (Treasurer) to approve this.

Guidelines/Expectations for helping.

All of our members are expected to give a certain amount of time at Pony Club – this can include coaching, helping at working bees, helping at our annual ODE and/or a role on the committee. It is expected that a member will help at least 3 working bees AND our annual ODE (2 days), AND help set up and packing up at rallies or the equivalent time thereof.

Health and Safety

Somehow I have managed to get responsibility for this role again. We are all responsible for Health and Safety so if you see any issues or have any questions, please feel free to bring them to my attention or ask me.

A few important and new points:

There is a **hazard register** on the clubroom door. This will be up-dated for 2019 very soon Please make yourself familiar with this and contact me or a committee member with any suggestions.

A **fall register** needs to be filled in for ALL falls (even if the rider lands on their feet and pops straight back on). There is a more detailed form if medical or veterinary treatment is required.

Concussion documents

Last year NZPCA developed some new concussion documents. These are available on the NZPCA website, under the health and safety section. http://www.nzpca.org/rules-regulations/health-safety

There is a "Green Card" which is to be issued when a rider falls and has a suspected concussion. This Green Card means that the rider must go and be assessed by a registered medical practitioner and cleared before they can compete in pony club activities again. There is a 21 day stand down period for riders unless they have a medical certificate showing that they have been cleared to ride.

A new piece has been added to the NZPCA Health and Safety Policy around riders in **plaster**. No rider can participate in ridden Pony Club activities whilst in plaster.

Back protectors for riding at pony club.

Springston Pony Club recommends riders wear a back protector for ALL jumping, however SPC has bought its rules in line with NZPCA rules which state that riders must wear a back protector when jumping XC fences. (this is a change from the last couple of years when back protectors were compulsory for all jumping at SPC)



Team Gear

Please could team Managers Liaise with the team gear person (will be named soon), and sign out and in all team gear used for team events.

SPC Events for this year

Please note that the SPC ODE is 27th and 28th July 2018. We will need EVERYONE to help with both the set up before and on these days. Please diary these dates now.

We will also have a first start event, dates TBA soon.

Saddlery shops

If you are buying gear at any of the local saddlery shops, please tell them that you are from Springston Pony Club. At the end of the year they donate vouchers to us relating to the amount our members spend. We use these for the end of year Christmas party, prizes etc.

Use of grounds

Springston Pony Club members are welcome to use the grounds free of charge (please ensure you have paid your subs!). The combination code is sent to members, please do NOT share this. Non-members need to pay for each visit (even if they come with you!). Bookings are available with Katie Meyer, ph 027 538 7277.

Please ensure that all horse manure is picked up from the arenas and the grounds before you leave. There is a wheelbarrow and rake available, so there are no excuses.

Please also ensure all show jumping rails are picked up off the ground. Even if you didn't drop them please pick them up so we can keep them in good condition for as long as we can.

Please keep an eye out for "happenings" at the grounds, if you see something which shouldn't be happening, please let a committee member know ASAP.

Note we do not have any "casual riding members", any causal riders (non-members) need to pay \$10 per horse/pony each time they come.
