We have some children ready to sit C certificate shortly. I was told in November of last year that there would be C certificates running in the new year (February) and apparently these are coming up soon. Will keep you posted about dates.

Team Competitions 2019

There are a number of team events which you can put your name down for. Please watch out for e-mails asking for you to put your name forward. Many of them require that you are competing at the required level before applying. You are likely to be asked for a list of the results at competitions on your horse/pony. Please start keeping a note of these, if you have not already. Remember that you need to include ALL competitions, even the ones where things didn't go so well and you would prefer to forget you even went! This is so the selectors can get the whole picture.

Springston Pony Club - Team Events Selection Policy 2019

There are many team events held throughout the year in which riders can represent Springston Pony Club and experience the fun and camaraderie of being part of a team. The Selection Committee will email all Branch members to ask for names for team events as they come up through the year. Riders must be financial members and meet the rally attendance rule to ride in a team:

Rally Attendance Rule:

Riders with no certificate, D, D+ or C certificate – must have attended 5 rallies in the previous 12 months, 3 of which must be on the pony being ridden in the team event;

Riders with C+ certificate – must have attended 4 rallies in the previous 12 months, 2 of which must be on the pony being ridden in the team event;

Riders with B or A certificate – must have attended 3 rallies in the previous 12 months, 1 of which must be on the pony being ridden in the team event.

When selecting riders for team events, the overall goal is to select the strongest team first and give as many riders as possible the opportunity to ride in additional teams (or composite teams with other Branches). Some team events such as Collier Trophy and Stringer Trophy are specifically aimed at those riders jumping lower heights. Riders will be asked for results from competitions over the previous 12 months, so riders need to keep a record of their results through the year. It is not always necessary for a rider to have previous competition results as long as the Selection Committee can be sure the rider will be safe, especially out on cross country.

A team is always given a couple of jobs to do at team events, so a parent or helper for each rider must be available.

Please ensure that all horse manure is picked up from the arenas and the grounds before you leave. There is a wheelbarrow and rake available, so there are no excuses.

Please also ensure all show jumping rails are picked up off the ground. Even if you didn't drop them please pick them up so we can keep them in good condition for as long as we can.

Please keep an eye out for "happenings" at the grounds, if you see something which shouldn't be happening, please let a committee member know ASAP.

Note we do not have any "casual riding members", any causal riders (non-members) need to pay \$10 per horse/pony each time they come.



Collier Trophy

Collier Trophy is a Pony Club Teams, One Day Event (ODE), this year run by View Hill Pony Club. It was held at Waihora Pony Club on Sunday the 26th of May. This event is aimed at "up and coming" riders to experience the fun of competing in a team. It is an eventing competition comprising of dressage, show jumping and cross country.

Springston entered two teams and one of our members rode for a Halswell PC team.

The Springston Brown team was made up of:

The riders were all very new to eventing, with it being Emily, Lily and Renee's 2nd ever ODE and Meg's 1st!

We arrived at Waihora at 7am, to a surprisingly mild, warm morning!

First up was dressage. The team quickly tacked up in PC team uniform and headed over to the arenas for gear checking. We were the second team on for dressage. The team all rode their tests at the same time in the six arenas.

Next we tied the ponies up and covered them, left them eating their breakfast and headed off to walk the show jumping and cross country courses as a team. After that there was time for food and drinks, then time to gear up and juggle SJ and XC (and some riders were needed at both at the same time!).

The team had ok dressage scores. Great SJ rounds with just one stop, otherwise everyone went clear and jumped well. Cross country was a mixed bag for the team with some brilliant clear rounds, some stops and a fall, which meant the team didn't finish with a live score. The girls encouraged and supported each other admirably, they had a lot of fun and learnt a huge amount. It was such a fantastic learning opportunity and experience for these riders. The event finished with mounted prizegiving – while it would have been nice to head home and have a cup of tea, it was worth the effort of gearing the ponies up again and seeing all the teams line up in their PC colours.

Congratulations to all the Springston PC riders who all rode extremely well and should be very proud of themselves.
